

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan – Progress Report

An orientation on pisciculture was held in the month of August 2021 for SHG groups of UBA adopted villages. As a follow up of the orientation, the college initiated a three months long pisciculture course under Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY). Around 70 trainees from 20 villages, including the UBA adopted villages, were enrolled for this course, which commenced in the month of April 2022 and will end in July 2022. The trainees also got an opportunity to visit Sasya Shyamala Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda University, Sonarpur for an exposure visit. This course is conducted under the leadership of College Principal, Rev. Dr. Dominic Savio, SJ and coordinated by the Vice Principal of the Rural campus at Raghabpur, Rev. Fr. Johnson Padiyara, SJ and his team. This initiative helped the college establish convergence with other government flagship programmes.
